The Journey

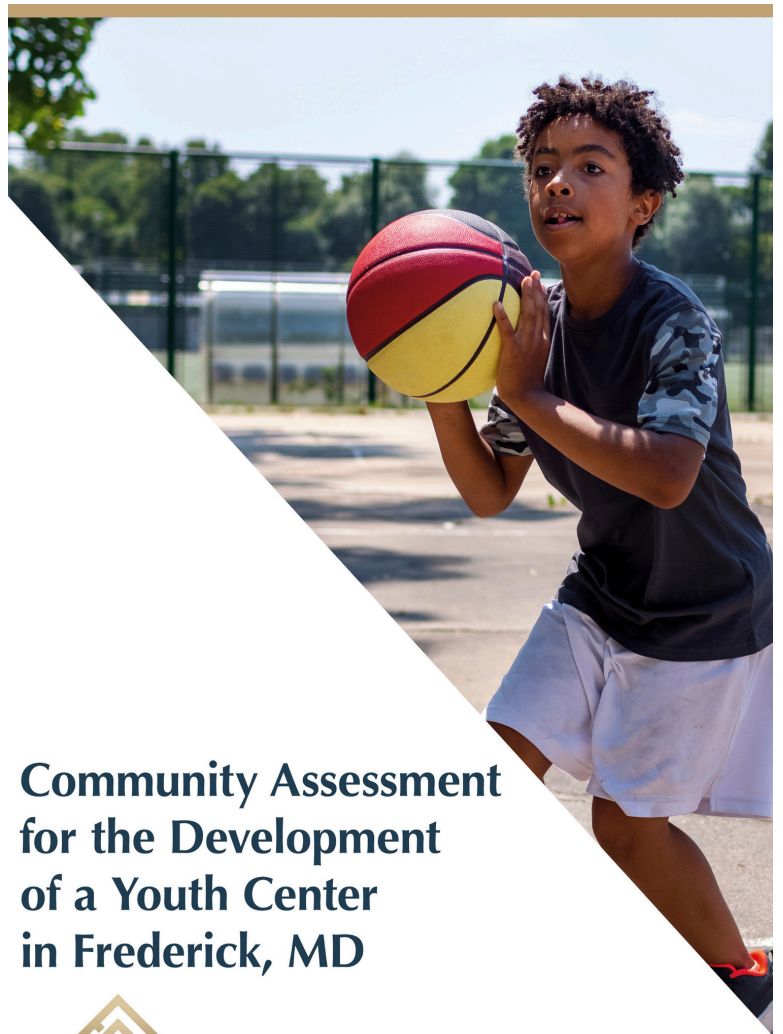
The journey began in 2022 with a community-wide assessment to explore how Frederick County could better support its young people. The assessment engaged youth, parents, educators, and community leaders to identify critical needs. It revealed three key outcomes: the need for a dedicated space for youth, a network to connect resources and reduce silos, and a platform to elevate youth voices in decision-making.

From this work, the Youth Council was created. It began in early 2024 with a clear goal: to ensure young people had a seat at the table and could influence the decisions that impact their lives. The Youth Council quickly became a driving force, providing leadership, insight, and energy to shape community initiatives.

The assessment findings also inspired the creation of the 12-to-24 Collaborative—a network designed to align efforts and connect services for young people. By working in partnership with the Youth Council, the Collaborative ensures that youth voices remain central to planning and action.

Another key result of the assessment was the vision for a youth center—a space where young people can gather, learn, and thrive. The Youth Council was instrumental in shaping the concept, ensuring it reflects the needs and aspirations of those it serves.

This journey continues to build momentum. The Youth Council, the Collaborative, and the youth center represent a shared commitment to creating a stronger, more connected community driven by the voices and leadership of its young people.

In 2025, the Youth Council welcomed new voices following a rigorous application process that received over 80 applications from youth across Frederick. From this highly competitive pool, 10 new Youth Council Members were seated, along with 5 Youth Council Liaisons. While the selection process was difficult, it was also energizing—an exciting testament to the strong foundation laid by previous Youth Council members.

The retreat created space for connection, shared values, and continuity as leadership transitioned from one cohort to the next. Orientation included laughter, skits exploring different leadership styles, and reflective activities such as letters to future selves, facilitated by Dr. Laura Sherwood, Youth Council Mentor. These experiences helped new members feel welcomed, connected, and prepared to lead.

Back-to-School Wellness in the Park: Youth Wellness in Action

The Youth Council partnered with the City of Frederick and Transformative Arts Project to host a Back-to-School Wellness in the Park Resource Fair, bringing together families, youth, and community partners for an evening centered on connection and well-being. Community members attended with their families, including County Executive Jessica Fitzwater, highlighting strong cross-sector support for youth wellness.

Youth Council members played an active leadership role by facilitating a community mural-painting project focused on emotions, creating space for creative expression and dialogue around mental health. Youth also addressed the community prior to the outdoor screening of *Inside Out 2*, helping frame the evening around emotional awareness, resilience, and youth wellness.

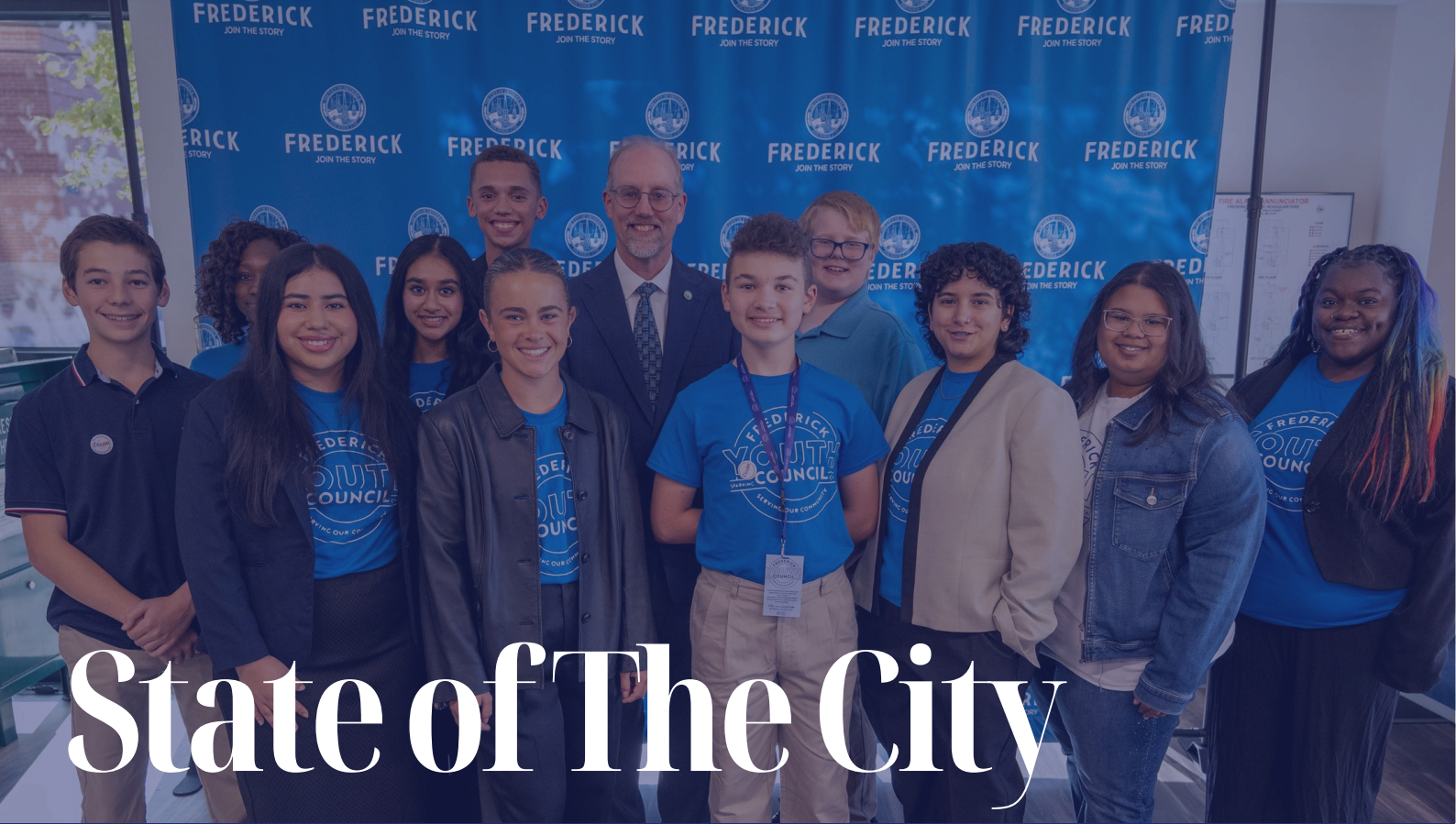
The event created a welcoming, accessible space where families could connect with local resources, learn about available supports, and engage in meaningful conversations about mental health and wellness—right in the heart of the community.

Scheduled to open in 2028, the Youth Center has been shaped by the voice of youth at every stage—from early visioning to discussions about how the space should look and feel, as well as what programs, activities, and support services should be offered.

Through ongoing feedback and collaboration, the Youth Council continues to play a critical role in informing design and policy decisions, ensuring the Youth Center reflects the needs, creativity, and aspirations of young people across Frederick.
